

THE INTERNATIONAL SECTIONS IN THE HAUTS-DE-SEINE (92) DEPARTMENT

NOTE OF INFORMATION

The international Sections represent one of the instruments to diversify the linguistic educational options provided for students, and to boost the international appeal of the *Paris-Ile-de-France* Region, in connection with academic goals.

Objective

This bilingual system welcomes in the same section French and foreign students with sufficient motivation and linguistic competence. It makes it possible :

- For French students to learn and practise a foreign language in-depth.
- To facilitate the arrival and integration of foreign students in the French school system.
- To promote the transmission of the cultural heritage of students' native countries.

The education curriculum in international Sections

In primary school, pupils attend at least three hours of classes in the Section language. These hours are included in the weekly schedule of 24 hours.

From the first year of secondary education, two school subjects are taught in the Section language, as outlined in the programmes of these classes :








- Section language and literature (4 additional weekly hours) ;
- History and geography (4 hours for all classes, 2 of which are taught in the Section language, except for international Chinese and Korean Sections, in which pupils attend an additional 1.5 weekly hours of mathematics taught in the Section language.

Examinations and diplomas

Students in international Sections can take two specific examinations :

- *The diplôme national du brevet, option internationale (DNBI) :*
Students take all the common core examinations plus two specific oral examinations, in 'language and literature' and 'history and geography' (mathematics for the Chinese and Korean sections). These oral examinations take place in the Section language and are organised by the school.
 - *The international option of the Baccalaureate (OIB) :*
The examination includes all the school subjects of their track, to the exclusion of the first foreign language (LV1) and 'history and geography' (mathematics for the Chinese and Korean Sections). For these two school subjects, students take specific oral and written examinations in the Section language.

Registration process

The school operates a preselection of candidates by studying the applications. Incomplete application forms will not be considered.

This preselection process determines which candidates will be invited to take entry tests.

For nursery and primary schools

→ oral admission tests and interviews.

For secondary schools

→ entry tests (written tests in foreign languages)

→ admission tests (oral tests)

- **From 12 to 25 March 2019** : The *IEN* or secondary schools send letters of invitation to students that have been deemed eligible to take entry tests.
- **From 25 March 2019** : entry and admission tests.

For international Sections in nursery and primary schools, the *IEN* will send admission decisions to families from 23 May 2019.

For international Sections in secondary schools, admission decisions will be conveyed to families :

- By the *collège* of their choice for *6e*, from 7 June 2019.
- By the *lycée* of their choice for *2nde*, from 27 June 2019.
- By the *Direction académique départementale (DSDEN)* for all other classes and levels, from the end of June 2019.
