Two categories of organisations



Academic sector

- public /private higher education establishments awarding academic degrees
- public /private non-profit research organisations whose primary mission is to pursue research
- √ international European interest organisations (e.g. CERN, EMBL)



Non-academic sector

- ✓ any entity not included in the academic sector:
- ✓ e.g. large companies, SMEs, NGOs, museums, hospitals
- √ international organisations (e.g. UN, WHO)



Standardised legal validation of entities is applied to determine the domain of each participant

Criterion 1 - Excellence

Quality, innovative aspects and credibility of the research programme (including inter/multidisciplinary and inter-sectoral aspects)

- Introduction, objectives and overview of the research programme
- Research methodology and approach
- Originality and innovative aspects of the research programme

Quality and innovative aspects of the training programme (including transferable skills, inter/multidisciplinary and inter-sectoral aspects

- Role of non-academic sector in the training programme
- Recruitment Deliverables per Beneficiary
- Main Network-Wide Training Events, Conferences and Contribution of Beneficiaries

Quality of the supervision (including mandatory joint supervision for EID and EJD projects)

- Qualifications and supervision experience of supervisors

Quality of the proposed interaction between the participating organisations

- Synergies between participants

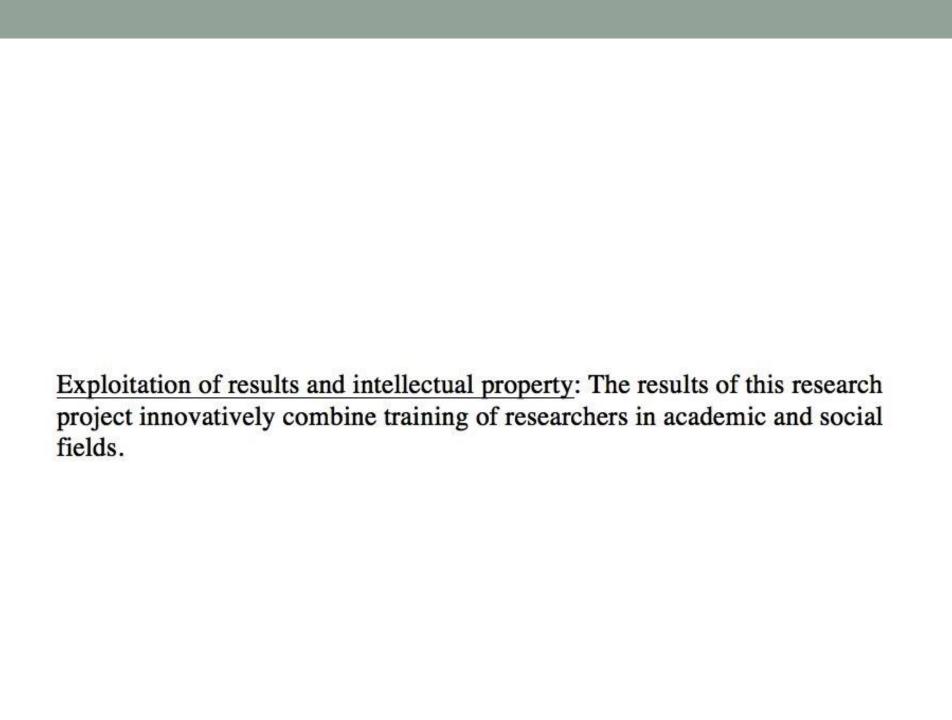
Enhancing research- and innovation-related human resources, skills, and working conditions to realise the potential of individuals and to provide new career perspectives

Contribution to structuring doctoral / early-stage research training at the European level and to strengthening European innovation capacity, including the potential for:

- a) meaningful contribution of the non-academic sector to the doctoral/research training, as appropriate to the implementation mode and research field
- b) developing sustainable joint doctoral degree structures (for EJD projects only)

Effectiveness of the proposed measures for communication and dissemination of results
